Local Laws for Backyard Chickens - Insteading

Build a comfy coop. The perfect chicken coop has three main components: a nesting box for laying eggs, an elevated perch for sleeping, and a mesh exterior to guard against predators. You can also add an enclosed area outside the coop, known as a run, where the chickens can roam free during the day.
